2. What is Sports Premium Funding?

In 2013, the government announced spending of £150 million per year to be used in schools throughout the UK, specifically to improve the provision of physical education and sport in primary schools. Schools are free to spend the funding in whatever area of PE and sport that they feel needs to be improved upon. Examples can range from buying in coaches to purchasing new equipment.

The Government has recently announced that for 2017-2018 the budget will be increased. With this change, we estimate our budget for the year to be £17, 660. This Sports Premium document has been written to that figure, with the money being spent as and when it is received.

3. Physical Education and Sport at St. Leonard's Primary School

At St. Leonard's Primary School we will use the money effectively in order to implement a PE programme which will ensure that all pupils leaving our school are physically literate and have the knowledge, skills and motivation necessary to equip them for a healthy lifestyle and a lifelong love of physical activity and sport. Pupils at St. Leonard's participate in two, one hour structured PE sessions per week. These are delivered by class teachers. Each class teacher will have at least half a term of mentoring/coaching from high quality sports practitioners (Bee Active) We aim to deliver high quality PE following the National Curriculum. This year we plan to use the additional funding to:

- Engage all our pupils in regular physical activity
- Continue to increase the opportunities for all pupils to participate in competitive sport (particularly SEND, DIS and in-active pupils)
- Provide high quality CPD for all of our teachers to ensure sustainability/high quality teaching for the future
- Educate the children in how to manage their fitness and wellbeing
- Provide a broader range of sports and activities to all of our pupils through half termly enrichment days
- Increase our association with local external sporting agencies and sports clubs, providing in and out of school sporting opportunities for our pupils.
- Increase children's participation in sports at break times and lunchtimes.
- Purchase new equipment to ensure PE is well resourced
- Purchase team kits for pupils to wear to competitions
- Enhance our provision of the swimming curriculum to ensure a greater number of our pupils meet the National Curriculum requirements

The money is to be used as outlined below:

- Pay for affiliation, entry fees and certificates/stickers for sports competitions/sports day
- Pay for a highly qualified sports practitioner to up-skill teachers, through mentoring and coaching. To plan and deliver high-quality PE sessions (with teachers) and provide lunch time and after school clubs
- Purchase new P.E. equipment
- Fund sport enrichment days
- Purchase team kits
