A new robot called Digit, designed to be human-like and that is capable of lifting and moving items, is being tested in warehouses of the online retailer, Amazon. The robot is in its first few weeks of trials at Amazon's facility in Seattle, USA, as the company tries to improve automation in its processes. To begin with, the robot is being taught to pick up and move empty boxes to ensure that they are ready for reuse. The yellow boxes, or totes, are used throughout the company's fulfilment process.





## Year 2

Year 2 have been busy this week. We have started learning all of our Nativity songs as well as our lines for the Christmas play. We are looking forward to starting rehearsals on the stage next week. On Monday, children talked about anti-bullying and made lots of noise focusing on kindness. They wore some lovely odd socks to school and even designed their own kindness odd socks.



## Year 3

Year 3 have been doing lots for anti-bullying week. It started with Odd Socks Day on Monday where we wore odd socks to school and also designed our own odd socks in class. Then we discussed online identify and how to keep ourselves safe online and report anything nasty or scary. Year 3 know that they shouldn't post pictures of themselves without an adult's approval and never talk to someone they don't know. Later on that week, Year 3 had a chat with the PCSO about keeping safe and discussed when you should call for emergency services. They even got to try on some of the police hats and bulletproof vest - they were very heavy!

## Year 4

Year 4 have settled back into school incredibly well after their half term break. They are currently writing a biography all about Julius Caesar and all of the children have found it fascinating, learning all about his life and how we can present our ideas in the form of a biography. Children have been taking part in anti-bullying week this week. They have signed pledges committing themselves to 'making a noise' about bullying, they have designed their own odd socks and wrote about who their trusted people are. We even tried to learn the song but found the rapping quite hard!! We have also started listening to a sci-fi Podcast called The Rez which includes it's own game and comic book online all about being kind to yourself and others. Well done Year 4 on a great couple of weeks.



## Year 5

Another busy two weeks have flown by in Year 5. We finally printed our lino-cut poppies, using ink and rollers and we think they look spectacular!! We hope you agree! We have been hard at work reading Good Night Mister Tom in English and are writing diary entries from the viewpoint of a WW2 evacuee. In our topic lessons, we have been learning about what caused the start of the Second World War and why people were evacuated away from large cities. The children are very enthusiastic and keen to learn in these lessons. On Monday, we marked the start of Anti-Bullying week by wearing odd socks. We discussed how we are all unique and to look for signs of when banter with friends can turn to bullying.



## Year 6

Y6 have had a brilliant two weeks and working extremely hard in all subjects. They have produced some brilliant writing based on War Horse using a range of descriptive language features. In topic, we have started to learn about WW2 and the reasons for it as well as investigating Anderson Shelters in preparation for making our own structures. As well as this, we have had a local PCSO in to visit us and discuss risks, social media and how to make the right choices as we transition into high school. Rock Steady, was a highlight of our last couple of weeks where the children were immersed into band life and were given the opportunity to play a range of musical instruments as well as watch a St. Leonard's band play a song together. All in all, a great few weeks.

## Leo's Den

Over the last two weeks the children have been very busy in Leo's Den doing lots of different activities. We kick started the new half term doing a firework art picture using glue, sugar and paint. Very messy but the children enjoyed doing it.

For Remembrance Sunday the children created a poppy using sugar paper, glue and felt pens. We explored what the poppy symbolised and the meaning of each part of the poppy. This week for Anti-Bullying Week, the children designed a pair of odd socks.


