
## A note from Miss Roberts.....


## Census Day

## Nursery

Our theme this half term is Nursery Rhymes. This week we have been learning the Nursery Rhyme, Humpty Dumpty. We have been singing the song together at circle time and have made up some actions to the song. We have designed and collaged our own Humpty Dumpty's, each one is very unique. We have been tracing and colouring in pictures to promote our pencil grip and pencil control. We have been investigating different construction materials to find out what makes the best and strongest wall. We measured the walls we built to see which one is the longest and tallest and we have also had a go at using scissors to make our own Humpty Dumpty puppets.



## Reception

Reception have returned to school with lots of enthusiasm! This week we started our new topic 'Let's Imagine', where we will be focusing on different fairy tales this half term. This week we have been learning 'Goldilocks and The Three Bears', the children have loved retelling the story using masks, building different sized beds and chairs and painting pictures from the story.

## Year 1

This week the Year One children had lots of fun dressing up as African animals to start off their new Topic! They learnt about the animals that live in Africa, painted a jungle landscape, made their own lion faces and practised African drumming! In English, the children have been busy learning how to gather information using books and the internet to write their own animal fact files.



## Year 2

Year 2 had their Geography WOW day on Monday to launch their new topic linked to Africa. The children had an exciting day and enjoyed dressing up as African animals. The class learnt information about the continent of Africa, listened to African music, learnt facts about African animals, sketched pictures of giraffes and cheetahs, painted an African sunset picture and baked benne cakes.



## Year 3

Year 3 have started a new book in English this week called Tuesday. They have used their inference and predicting skills to think about what might happen next and where the characters might go using clues from the book. In maths, year 3 have been looking at the 8 times table. This has been a tricky times table to learn but year 3 can represent counting in 8s in a bar model, array and equal groups to help them get to the answer. Also, year 3 have been creating their own digital flipbook animations in computing and have understood the different elements to creating a moving picture. Some children used their science knowledge to show a plant growing and other children had clouds or hands moving in their animation.

## Year 4

This week, Year 4 have enjoyed starting a lot of their new learning for this term. We have begun our new topic - Extreme Survival - and we have enjoyed discussing all the knowledge we already have as well as the facts and information we would like to research. In Art, we will be learning how to use watercolours effectively to produce landscape pictures. We enjoyed learning how to create different shades of colour and blend by just adding water. In science our new topic is Electricity and we have been thinking about all the different appliances we use that run on electricity from the mains or batteries. It's been a very busy week!



## Year 5 and Year 6

Today, Year 5 and 6 have had great fun on their WOW Day for their new topic, which is all about North America. The children came dressed as famous North Americans, from the past and present. We had a Joe Biden, Donald Trump, Michael Jackson, Marilyn Monroe and Harvey Milk! Other children came as American sports stars and dressed in red white and blue.

We have learnt facts about North America, been on a scavenger hunt, completed map work, learnt about flags, time zones, climates and physical features. This afternoon we have learnt about the importance of totem poles to Native American Indians and designed and made our own animal faces, using oil pastels. We will be displaying them on top of one another to make our own totem pole in the classroom - a photo of the finished product will be in the next edition of Leonard's Life!

The children have been busy taking part in new challenges. The older children had the opportunity to learn to knit, which was quiet challenging with a few dropped stitches a long the way. The younger children have taken part in board games using numbers and using their memory to recall facts.


#### Mutual Respect and Tolerance

## In the news this week

A study from the University of Valencia, in Spain, found that print reading could boost skills by six to eight times more than digital reading, for example, on an e-reader or tablet. The study, published in the Review of Educational Research, also found that while there is a negative relationship between digital reading and comprehension for primary school pupils, the relationship turns positive for secondary school-aged pupils.
