VIP Education

The school will be working closely with VIP Education to support our families further. Schools have been asked to track pupil attendance at school more closely this academic year and to tackle persistent absence and lateness.

Ofsted

Since September 2019, attendance and punctuality is covered under the "Behaviour and Attitudes Judgment" in Ofsted reports.

Inspectors will evaluate the extent to which pupils have high attendance and are punctual, looking for evidence of a strong focus on attendance and punctuality in schools so that disruption is minimised.

We know if children are in education, they will have more chance to succeed educationally. We want to work with our families to remove any barriers to attendance and offer solutions to support our families further.



We hope you find this beneficial and helps develop positivity!



World Book Day - Dressing up



45-year-old Mar Galcerán from Spain has become the country's first elected parliamentarian with Down's syndrome. Maria del Mar Galcerán Gadea is thought to be the first person with the genetic disorder to join a European regional or national parliament. She has been involved with politics since she was 18, when she joined Spain's conservative People's Party. Speaking to the media, Mar Galcerán said she wants to be seen as a person, and not for her disability.

Should I keep my

child off school?



Until...

Chickenpox	at least 5 days from the onset of the rash and until all blisters have crusted over	
Diarrhoea and Vomiting	48 hours after their last episode	
Cold and Flu-like illness (including COVID-19)	they no longer have a high temperature and feel well enough to attend. Follow the national guidance if they've tested positive for COVID-19.	
Impetigo	their sores have crusted and healed, or 48 hours after they started antibiotics	
Measles	4 days after the rash first appeared	
Mumps	5 days after the swelling started	
Scabies	they've had their first treatment	
Scarlet Fever	24 hours after they started taking antibiotics	
Whooping Cough	ugh 48 hours after they started taking antibiotics

Head lice	Tonsillitis
Threadworms	Slapped cheek

Nursery

To continue with our 'Let's imagine'
Theme we have learnt 'I'm a little teapot'
and 'Incy Wincy Spider' over the past two
weeks. Nursery have been very busy outside working together to construct a
house fit for a tea party in the Builders
yard. In our maths we are singing number
songs and the number 1. In phonics we
have been leaning all about initial sounds
and what sounds our names start with.



Reception

Reception have continued with their topic 'Lets Imagine'. We have focused on the story 'The Princess and the Pea'. Children have enjoyed learning the story, creating crowns to wear, building models of the castle and retelling the story in our Writing area. We have also enjoyed our fairy tale dress up day, coming in as our favourite characters!



Year 1

Year One have been learning the story Giraffes Can't Dance in English this week. They discussed how Gerald the Giraffe must have felt when he couldn't dance and how his feelings changed throughout the story when he finally learned how to dance! This linked in nicely with our work on emotions for Children's Mental Health Week. The children also enjoyed Sports Enrichment this week and had lots of fun playing laser tag!



Year 2

Children in Year 2 have been busy again over the last 2 weeks. In Maths, children have been learning equal groups, arrays, multiplication sentences, dividing and counting in 2s, 5s and 10s.

In English, Y2 have enjoyed reading their story The Laughing Giraffe and learnt lots of African animals such as egrets, weaver birds and kudu. In Geography children have been learning more about Africa. This week they have learnt about National Parks and had fun creating a map of their own African National Park with safari routes.







Year 3

Year 3 had lots of fun playing laser tag on Tuesday for their sports enrichment. They worked well in teams to try and defeat their opponents and protect each member of the group. In Science, year 3 have discovered that our pupils change size depending on the sun light and they really enjoyed watching each other's pupil change size when their eyes were closed and suddenly opening them to the bright classroom. Some children said it was like a magic trick!

Year 4

There has been a lot going on in Year 4 over the last week or so. In science, we have been continuing our learning about electrical circuits and

the children enjoyed making a human circuit so we could test the conductivity of various materials. We have been lucky enough to have two sport enrichment sessions in the last week. One focused on healthy lifestyles and in the second we played laser tag (which we loved!) On Tuesday, we learned about how we can have a positive influence when we are online. We had an online safety quiz and we designed our own positive influencer. It has also been Mental Health Week and today we have played games based on the Zones of Regulation and made our own Zones of Regulation fortune teller to help support us when we are feeling our different emotions. We are now looking forward to a well earned rest after all our hard work!



Year 5

Year 5 have been hard at work this week finishing off their own versions of Snow White in New York or their own choice of fairy tale. We have begun to research New York City and will be writing a persuasive text, encouraging our audience to visit the amazing city. In art, we have begun to paint our New York City landscapes, in an art-deco style and are looking forward to seeing our finished efforts. On Tuesday, the children thoroughly enjoyed taking part in our half termly sport enrichment session of laser tag - which they thought was great fun.











Year 6

Over the past two weeks, Y6 have engaged in a variety of learning and extra-curricular activities, which they have thoroughly enjoyed. This week, we engaged in a Sport Enrichment session which was Laser Tag. The children were enthusiastic and excited by the activity and can't wait to have another go! As well as this, we have immersed ourselves into our Art this week, putting together our final sketches of our Clarice Cliff themed New York art. Every child has produced some wonderful drawings of New York with some very 1920's inspired sketches. In line with this theme, Y6 have been focusing on an alternative version of Snow White which is based in New York in the 1920's. We have explored a range of ambitious vocabulary and begun to think about our own version of the story which we are going to be writing for another Y6 class. All in all a great few weeks!



Leo's Den

Over the last two weeks the children have been busy finding out about Chinese New Year. The older children read about the different animals of the Chinese zodiac and what they represented. They enjoyed finding out what animal they were, from the Chinese Zodiac. This year is the year of the dragon, children made dragon masks using bright coloured felt tips.
