

#### World Book Day – Dressing up



In countries across Europe, including Romania, Belgium, France, Hungary, Poland and Greece, tractors have been blocking city streets and motorways as farmers protest against certain European Union (EU) rules. # **Sporting Events**

On Tuesday 27th February, our Year 5/6 football team were invited to play a friendly match against Oakridge. The first fifteen minutes did not go to plan and we found ourselves 5 - 0 down. We came out fighting and after 15 minutes we only trailed by one goal, it was 6-5! The final score was 8-6 to Oakridge but I can honestly say it was one of, if not THE best school match I have ever seen. I was really proud of how our boys didn't give up and carried on being competitive. My man of the match was Archie, who despite rugby being his sport, showed excellent defensive skills and really frightened Oakridge's attackers! All the boys played superbly and I am looking forward to our next competitive matches in April. Thank you to all of the parents for transporting the boys and supporting us. #### **Nursery**

Over the past two weeks Nursery have been reading The Dinosaur That Pooped a Pirate. Last week the children were busy learning the names of the different dinosaurs; they painted a picture of their favourite. This week the children have had lots of fun learning about pirates! They made up their own pirate stories and made pirate hats!



#### Reception

We have been very busy in Reception. Last week we focused on 'Chinese New Year', we looked at how it is celebrated and different traditions. We learnt the Chinese Zodiac story and had fun making lanterns and dancing dragons. This week we have continued with our topic 'Let's Imagine' and found out all about the British Monarchy. The children have really impressed me with their knowledge and shared their own experiences of different castles they have visited.

#### Year 1

Year 1 have had a wonderful few weeks with Mrs Hitchen. We have been using the practical apparatus in our Maths lessons to help us solve problems. We have been learning to make a number, draw a picture of the a number and write a number. We then used this knowledge to help us with doubling numbers.

We have been reading the Gruffalo in our English lessons and produced some fabulous sentences including adjectives and nouns.





#### Year 2

Year 2 have made a wonderful return to school over the past 2 weeks. They jumped straight into their learning and have taken every challenge with enthusiasm and resilience. Well done everyone! In English, we have been reading One Word for Kids which tells the story of a school child finding a special word to encourage them the whole year through. We made bracelets to celebrate this and have made a great start on our own retell of their experiences with their one word. We are continuing our topic on Africa and have learnt all about the Maasai people, comparing their lives with our own. We have also started our D&T project for International School Meals Day by testing and rating lots of fruit! Keep up the amazing work and attitude Y2!





#### Year 3

Year 3 have been looking at length and height in maths and have enjoyed measuring equipment in the classroom. They used metre sticks and rulers and decided which unit of measure would be the most accurate. Some children measured the height of Miss O'Neill in metres and centimetres. Then they produced a maths poster showing all of their knowledge of length and included converting mm to cm and cm to m.

#### Year 4

This week, Year 4 have been busy carrying out lots of research about Bedouin people who live in and around desert areas of North Africa. They have been using non fiction sources and the internet to find out about their lifestyle, homes and food. We have started sessions with Commando Matt and this week we explored key concepts such as teamwork, communication and resilience and worked together to produce posters. We have also started our latest D&T project of making a torch and started off by disassembling torches to find out about the essential components needed to make our own. This half term we have started to have sessions about 'Healthy Lifestyles'. We are enjoying working with Sports4All to learn more about the importance of different food groups and how we can eat healthily to support our bodies and minds.









#### Year 5

Year 5 have been really busy over the last two weeks, since returning from our half term break. This week we have been completing our New York skyline, Clarice Cliff inspired, paintings they look fantastic. In science, we tested the parachutes we made at home to see if they could safely carry an egg to the ground from a 3 m drop - we used our knowledge of air resistance and gravity to help us to make predictions about whose may be successful and had great fun. This week, we have been looking at Newton meters and planning an experiment to find out which shoe has the best grip/most friction. We are also enjoying our weekly recorder lessons from Mr Yard and can all hear the progress that we are making (thankfully!).





#### Year 6

Over the past two weeks, Year 6 have been working extremely hard in all areas of their learning. We have been focusing on earthquakes in Topic, particularly focusing on the San Andreas Fault. The children are now fountains of knowledge and can speak confidently about earthquakes across North America. As well as this, we have been developing reading. New reading challenges have been introduced to spark a love of reading in Y6. I have no doubt that we will see the children reading a range of different genres to increase their love of reading. In Science, we have begun to learn about our bodies, specifically the circulatory system which the children have become fascinated with. I'm excited to see how the topic unfolds as we learn more. Lastly, we have completed our Clarice Cliff style New York landscapes which are fantastic - we can't wait to display them! All in all another great two weeks.
