### Yes

#### Until...

Chickenpox	at least 5 days from the onset of the rash and until all blisters have crusted over	
Diarrhoea and Vomiting	48 hours after their last episode	
Cold and Flu-like illness (including COVID-19)	they no longer have a high temperature and feel well enough to attend. Follow the national guidance if they've tested positive for COVID-19.	
Impetigo	their sores have crusted and healed, or 48 hours after they started antibiotics	
Measles	4 days after the rash first appeared	
Mumps	5 days after the swelling started	
Scabies	they've had their first treatment	
Scarlet Fever	24 hours after they started taking antibiotics	
Whooping Cough	48 hours after they started taking antibiotics


Last Friday, 17 of our Year 5 and 6 girls took part in a national event called #LetGirlsPlay -Biggest Ever Football Session, over the road at Stafford Town. The aim of the event, held on International Women's Day, was to be part of a campaign to influence and drive change, showing that football can and should be played by girls. The girls had a fabulous morning, taking part in training sessions and matches. One of the teams were unbeaten in all of their matches! Well done girls, you were a credit to St Leonard's and showed amazing teamwork skills.





#### Nursery

This week in Nursery our topic has been Under the Sea. We have learnt about different sea creatures and where they live. We drew our favourite sea creature, cut out jelly fish and collaged Rainbow Fish. Outside we used the large construction to make a submarine, which the children enjoyed. In PE we had lots of fun moving around the hall pretending to be crabs, jelly fish and sharks.



#### Reception

Reception have continued to enjoy our topic 'Let's Imagine'. This week our text was 'The Princess and the Wizard' and all of our learning was based around the story. Children have been working really hard spotting magic tricky words, making magic wands and retelling the story. We carefully used split pins to make some wizards, we found this tricky but persevered and didn't give up. Well done Reception.

#### Year 1

Year 1 have been using practical apparatus to help us with our Maths this week. We have been revisiting number bonds and using known number bonds to help us write addition and subtraction number sentences using symbols. Next week, we will use these number bonds to help our part-part-whole and missing number problems.



#### Year 2

Year Two have had another busy couple of weeks! The children have been reading Voices in the Park and created their own artwork based on the story. They used charcoal and oil pastels to draw two trees, showing the perspectives of two story characters. This week the children have enjoyed learning about the fruit that grows in Europe and Africa, they made a fruit salad using a mixture of European and African fruits.





#### Year 3

Year 3 have really enjoyed British Science Week this week and have looked at: Sailing over time. They watched a video about how boats were made a very long time ago using tree trunks and they have carried out a float or sink investigation using oranges. Did you know a fresh orange with its peel floats on water but without the peel, the orange sinks!

Year 3 have designed their own boats using a plastic tubs and other equipment in the classroom. At the end of the week, we will see if the boats float or sink.

Year 4

This last fortnight in Year 4 has been as busy as ever! Last week we had a visit from a STEM Ambassador, Tony, who came in to talk to us about teeth and healthy eating. Tony is a dentist and he taught us about the different teeth we have in our mouths and why they are the shape they are. We also learned about foods and drinks that help to keep our teeth healthy as well as how to look after our teeth by brushing regularly. We have now started our Commando Joe sessions and in the first lesson we talked about values of teamwork, passion, respect and resilience and created posters together to show how we can work on these values. We had a lot of fun during our Sport Enrichment session this week developing different athletic skills - our favourites were throwing especially the javelins. This week has also been British Science Week and in Year 4 we are experimenting to create the most effective de-icer. We have been thinking of different variables that we could test and have planned out our own investigations to discover the most effective materials to make ice melt most quickly.



#### Year 5

Last week, Year 5 read the book, 'Voices in the Park', as part of World Book Day. The children found so many hidden messages and images in the book, which has contributed to some fantastic diary writing this week. We also made collages linked to the story and built book dens to read in, which they thoroughly enjoyed! Today, they were excited to have some rugby coaching by Leicester Tigers staff this is in preparation for a tag rugby tournament coming up in May.



#### Year 6



Over the past two weeks, Year 6 have been working extremely hard. As May approaches us, we have been working even harder ensuring that we are absorbing as much knowledge as possible. I am very proud of the progress all of the children are making in all subjects, particularly maths. In Topic, this week, we have focused on the Grand Canyon and debating how it was formed many millions of years ago. In Art, we have been creating some collages based on trees - this was inspired by our World Book Week book: Voices in the Park. The children have produced some really creative and interesting art work and we can't wait to display it. In Science, we have been exploring the circulatory system and how important it is to our bodies. All in all, a great few weeks!
