- Safeguard the welfare of all pupils in our care
- Provide a secure, happy and stimulating environment for all pupils to flourish in
- Encourage children to follow the school values and golden rules
- Provide a broad and balanced curriculum which challenges all children to reach their potential and fulfils the requirements of the National Curriculum
- Promote positive behaviour and foster a restorative environment
- Implement the school's behaviour policy in a fair and consistent manner
- Listen to concerns and work with parents and families to come to a satisfactory conclusion
- Make parents and families welcome whenever they visit the school
- Keep parents and families informed about children's progress and behaviour
- Communicate clearly and regularly on the website, through letters, newsletters and Class Dojo
- Encourage respect for all faiths and cultures within our school ethos
- Encourage all children to understand the importance of a healthy lifestyle

We expect that pupils will:

- Embody the school's values
- Follow the school's golden rules
- Always try their best and take responsibility for their own learning and behaviour
- Work hard to make progress
- Tell a member of staff if they are worried about anything
- Bring to school everything they need for the day
- Wear the correct school uniform

**We expect that the governors will:**

- Oversee the general financial and educational direction of the school
- Challenge and support staff to provide a secure, inclusive, stimulating learning environment for all children
- Attend as many school activities as possible to get to know the community broadly and deeply

We expect that parents and families will:

- Ensure children attend school and are here every-day, ready and on-time
- Ensure children wear the correct school uniform
- Encourage children to follow the school values and golden rules
- Support the school's behaviour policy
- Direct emails for staff to the school office
- Share positive messages via Class Dojo
- Raise concerns privately and at an appropriate time, not in front of children
- Attend parents' evenings and other activities where possible
- Communicate with one another when a message is passed to one parent or family member but not another
- Ensure children read regularly and provide opportunities for them to complete homework
- Pay for school dinners, trips and visits in line with policies and deadlines
- Keep up to date with communications sent out by school
- Conduct themselves appropriately whilst on school premises and communicate politely
